Policy exclusions (Alternative commissioning arrangements apply)

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If clinical assessment suggests serious underlying pathology rather than simple snoring, the patient should be referred accordingly.

If Obstructive Sleep Apnoea Syndrome is suspected, the patient should be managed in accordance with NICE Technology Appraisal TA139 - Continuous positive airway pressure for the treatment of obstructive sleep apnoea/hypopnoea syndrome.

Policy Statement

Surgical treatment of simple snoring (where snoring is not complicated by episodes of breathing cessation) is regarded as a procedure of low clinical priority and therefore <u>not</u> routinely commissioned.
